



From West Memphis: Driving west on I-40, merge onto I-440 W/E Belt W via Exit 159. Merge onto I-30 W via the exit on the left toward Hot Springs. Take Exit 111 and proceed on Hwy. 70 West (about 40 minutes). At Central Avenue turn right (Hwy. 7 North). The Arlington is located at the end of Bathhouse Row at 239 Central Avenue.


